



URBAN CAMP AT AUGSBURG COLLEGE

2014 Summer Camp Summary - July 7-11, 2014

Urban High School Scrubs Camp 2014 celebrated its 5th year with 89 students, a 39% increase from 2013. Students learned about many different careers in the health sciences. More than 70% (63) of the students attended camp on a scholarship. Camp was \$430 for a 5-day, day only camp experience.

With 20 different sessions/topics and 4 field trips, students experienced the many different careers related to the health sciences. These experiences included everything from physician's assistant, dental, mental health careers, nursing, biomedical to vet medicine. As one student stated, "This camp is definitely one of the best camps I have ever attended. The staff, the organization, and the overall curriculum were all educational, informational and fun!"

98% of students who attended camp reported that spending time on campus helped them better understand and visualize themselves at college. 99% reported overall satisfaction with their camp experience.

2014 Summer Camp Summary - July 21-24, 2014

Saint Paul College High School Scrubs Camp 2014 celebrated its 2nd year with 58 students, a 81% increase from 2013. Students learned about many different careers in the health sciences. Approximately 50% of the students received a scholarship to attend camp. Camp was \$355 for a 4-day, day only camp experience.

With 17 different sessions/topics and 2 field trips, students experienced the many different careers related to the health sciences. Students learned about nursing, anatomy, CPR, phlebotomy, psychology, pharmacy technician and more. As one student stated, *"I really enjoyed the simulations. It helped me visualize myself in the health field!"*

89% of students who attended camp reported that spending time on campus helped them better understand and visualize themselves at college. 97% reported overall satisfaction with their camp experience.
